#### Park Hours & Info

Dawn to dusk. Jakob is located on the trail about 0.25 miles from the Issaquah Community Center. The entire Rainier Trail runs approximately 2.5 miles in one direction and is rich with history.

#### **Parking**

There is a small lot at the Issaquah
Community Center and parking is
available on nearby streets. The
Community Center has public EV
chargers available for use for a small fee.

#### Trail Accessibility

Starting at the Community Center, walk south approximately 0.25 miles, past the Dog Park on the paved Rainier Trail. The trail is ADA, rolling vehicle and bicycle friendly. Note, if you are visiting downtown Issaquah, the Rainier Trail is easily accessible by foot.

#### Restrooms

Located in the Community Center. Hours are M-F 7am-9pm, Sat 8am-4pm. Closed on Sun.

#### **Public Transportation**

King County Metro provides bus service to the trailhead. Plan your visit by bus using TOTAGO, or consult the King County metro schedules 200, 208, 214 and 271. Sound Transit, route 554, also services the Rainier Trail.
